If we have learned anything over the past 18 months, it is the importance of HOME. A safe, secure place with enough space for everyone to have a little privacy, a little place to work or go to school, a little place to be happy.



With your help, Habitat continued to give a hand-up to our neighbors right here in Loudoun County:

- 61 homeowners, 232 individuals, including 133 children, experiencing the stability, security and wealth building that comes from owning an affordable home.
- 15 homes repaired impacting 33 individuals, many elderly, disabled and veterans, struggling to make needed repairs to their aging homes.
- 385 tons of good stuff donated to the ReStore keeping it out of landfills.
- 40 workshops offered through the *Tools for Life* Learning Center ranging in topics on money management, homeownership, home maintenance, and community building.

Those of us involved in the Habitat mission know the *hand-up* is long-lasting and life changing. Study after study draws a direct line between housing quality and the well-being of our COMMUNITIES through greater economic stability, access to quality education, increased civic and social engagement, and better health. The work of Habitat for Humanity makes our world a fairer place with HOPE that uplifts us all.

Tisha is a Certified Nursing Assistant in memory care and loves her work. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Tisha worked many extra hours to keep the residents of her facility safe. She was recently quoted as saying, “I believe we are going to make it through this time, and I believe we are all determined to keep our residents safe and healthy. We can do this!”

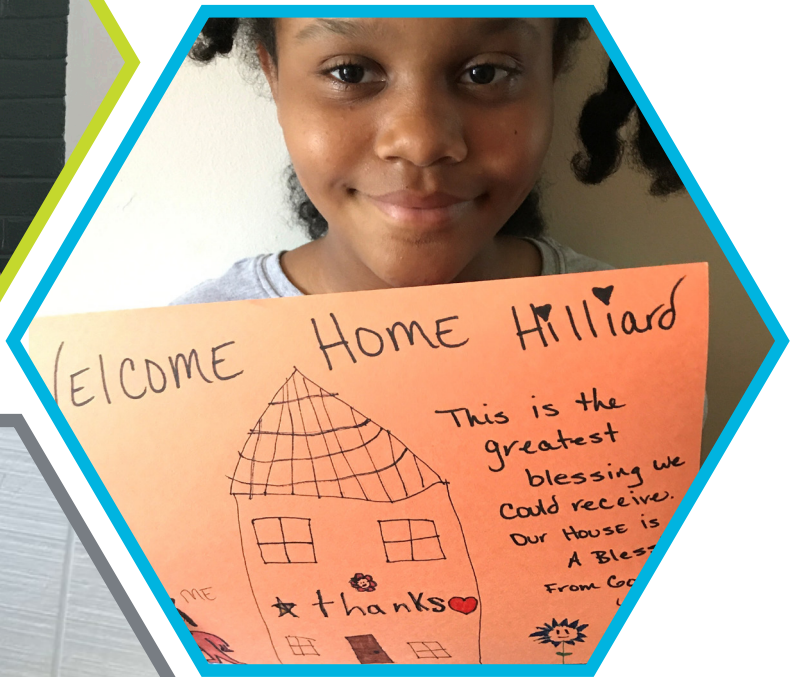

## A Space of My Own

Five years ago, Jenny Luevanos found herself in a difficult situation and in need of suitable housing for herself and her two children. Her caseworker suggested she apply to Loudoun Habitat's Homeownership Program but at the time, Jenny did not think she was financially ready to purchase a home. Instead, with the benefit of a discount from her employer, the family moved into a very small two-bedroom apartment.

In 2018, Jenny applied to Loudoun Habitat's Homeownership Program. Although her application was not approved, she learned what was needed to lower her debt and worked hard to improve her financial situation. Then in 2020, the second time she applied, she was ready for homeownership. Her application was approved and Jenny

and her family began their journey to homeownership through the Loudoun Habitat for Humanity program. With the help of the eight-week Home Buyers Club and one-on-one financial mentoring, Jenny worked to reduce debt and accumulate savings in preparation for owning a home.

While completing her sweat equity hours in the ReStore, at Habitat fundraising events, and renovating her future home, Jenny's joy and strength were inspirational. While working with a small team at her future home, Jenny was found upstairs in the master bedroom eating her lunch dreaming of the day the space would be her own. Standing proudly with her two children at the house dedication, Jenny realized this dream to come true.



# A Safe Place to Live

Living with cancer is hard enough. Add to it living in an unsafe home and you have the situation Shirley dealt with for several years. “I was afraid the tub would give away. With the floor warping, I was scared to be in the bathroom for long periods of time.”

Lucky for Shirley, she was referred to the Loudoun Habitat Home Repair Program by the Loudoun County Area Agency on Aging. The Habitat construction team reviewed Shirley’s house finding water damage, mold, and a bathtub that was not safe to use. The team went to work installing a new shower, replacing damaged walls and flooring, adding new windows, and other needed repairs to make Shirley’s home a safe place to live.

She described her participation in the Loudoun Habitat Home Repair Program. “They are like a savior to me. Being a widow with cancer made getting repairs done difficult. I am grateful and blessed that they were able to fix my issues. It means everything to me.”

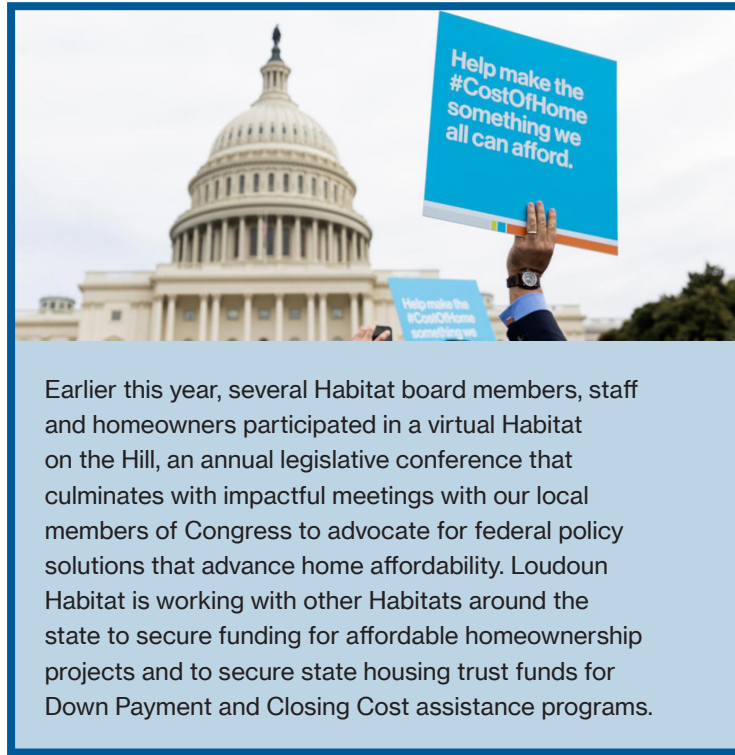

# Lifting our Voices

Advocacy means supporting and promoting a cause you believe in. At Habitat for Humanity, we advocate to change policies and systems so that we can eliminate barriers to adequate, affordable housing. Our vision is a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

Building is part of the solution, but the less visible aspects of housing like laws, regulations, systems and rules about land and the build environment are critical components, too. Sustainable and inclusive policies and systems can promote access to decent housing, while others can create barriers. And those barriers make it harder to find land for construction, build a home or be able to afford a place to live.



Earlier this year, several Habitat board members, staff and homeowners participated in a virtual Habitat on the Hill, an annual legislative conference that culminates with impactful meetings with our local members of Congress to advocate for federal policy solutions that advance home affordability. Loudoun Habitat is working with other Habitats around the state to secure funding for affordable homeownership projects and to secure state housing trust funds for Down Payment and Closing Cost assistance programs.

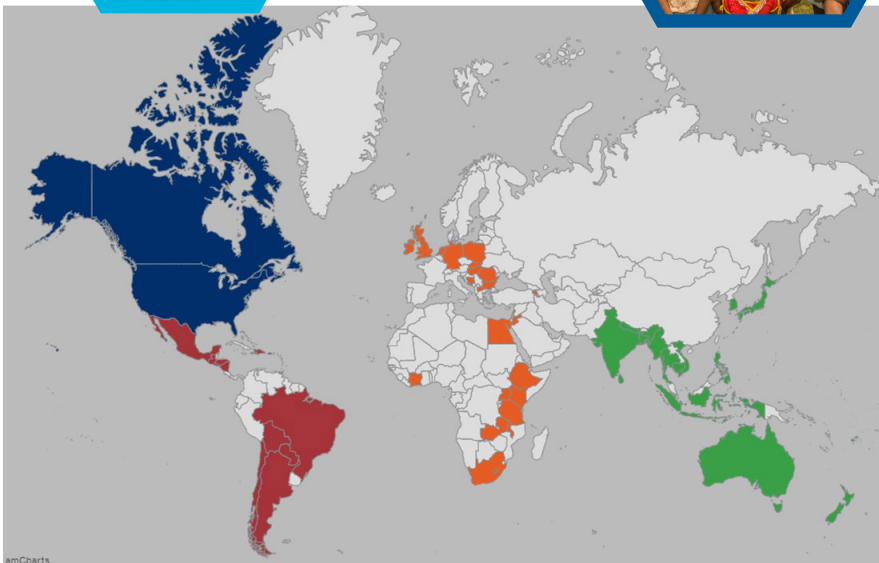


# Local Giving Makes Global Impact



Back in 1979, at a home dedication in Zaire, Habitat founder Millard Fuller received a tithe donation of \$200. That gift was used to launch a new Habitat affiliate in Guatemala. From that one gift, the entire Habitat tithe program started. A tithe is a gift, usually based on a percentage of income, that is given to support a broader mission. Traditionally, it was a gift given to a church, but Habitat adopted the concept to help support Habitat's international mission to build a WORLD where EVERYONE has a decent place to live.

Today the program is called the Global Impact Fund. Loudoun Habitat for Humanity supports the Global Impact Fund with funds each year to improve housing and sanitation conditions across the world. While funds raised in Loudoun County support programs in Loudoun County, we are able to magnify donations through the monthly tithe program that puts local contributions to work in 70 countries improving living conditions for more than 35 million people.

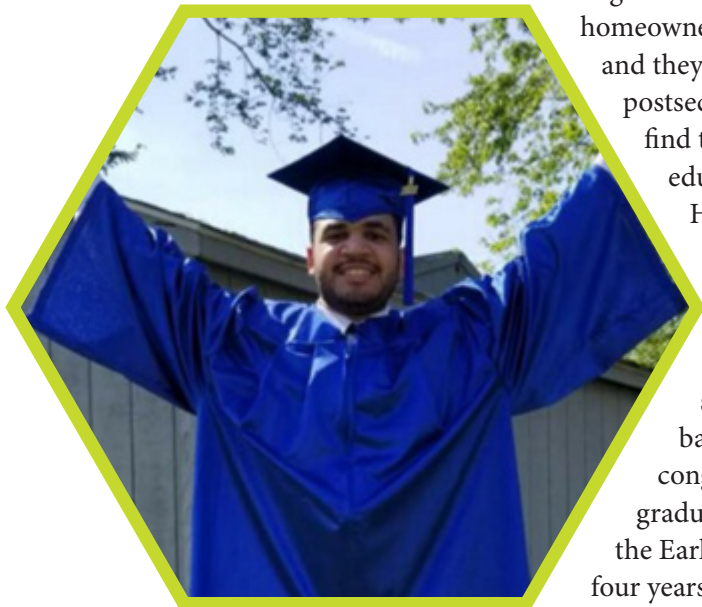

We build because we want to make this world a fairer place, to help make our communities beacons of equality. We know that when we do — when we join together — every improvement we make envelops and uplifts us all. What might seem for many families like an impossible dream of homeownership often starts with a whisper of hope — a small act of courage in its own right. And it makes all the difference.

## A Future With Promise

The graduation rate for children of Habitat homeowners is 19% higher than for renters, and they are twice as likely to acquire some postsecondary education. Habitat homeowners find that they can plan and save for higher education opportunities for their children. Here in Loudoun County, we have witnessed first-hand as many of our homeowners have celebrated their children's graduations from higher education. There are several homeowners that have gone back to school to earn degrees. Many congratulations to all the Loudoun Habitat graduates, especially CJ who graduated from the Earl L. Pulley Career Center. CJ completed four years after high school in a program that provides life skills and job training for young adults with disabilities.





# A Room of My Own

Claudia Solares worked for a year and a half preparing herself for homeownership. Upon completion of the eight-week Home Buyer education series, a requirement for all future homeowners, Claudia worked with her Loudoun Habitat financial mentor to learn ways to save money and prepare to manage a monthly mortgage payment. She found the skills to confidently manage her finances to be able to pay a mortgage.

Her new home has special meaning for Claudia's 12-year old daughter. "I'm super excited that I get my own room for the very first time and a backyard to play in." Her older daughter, who assisted with the sweat equity required prior to homeownership, summed up the family's feelings during the house dedication, "Thank you to the Loudoun Habitat for Humanity donors and volunteers. Thank you from my heart because they really help to make your dreams come true. Their efforts make an impact on real families. They might not realize that their donations come together to give a family their dream home. They are making a huge difference."

# Making an Impact Close to Home

Every day, thousands of volunteers around the world gather at Habitat construction sites to help build a world where everyone has a decent place to call home. While COVID limited our ability to have volunteers on the construction site, there were a few opportunities in recent months. One of these groups was from Avantus Federal that participated in a team build to help renovate a townhome in Sterling. Luke McFadden, who was on-site with the group explained, “There is great need within miles of our offices and homes. Loudoun Habitat is working in our neighborhoods and often really close to home. Being on site, we discovered that we can make an impact on our teams, our leadership and our communities.”

# Steps Forward During A Challenging Year



## Homeowner Advisory Council Established

The Homeowner Advisory Council is a group of Loudoun Habitat homeowners brought together to share their experience and insight and to raise community awareness about Loudoun Habitat programs and services.

## Raise the Roof Fundraiser Reframed

Due to COVID, our board and staff pivoted from our annual Gala to a series of smaller, private events. Events included a Pickleball Tournament, Casino Night, Motorcycle Ride, and a *The House Beer Built* event at Bear Chase Brewing.



## Pathways to Homeownership Class Begins

One of the most common reasons for not approving Loudoun Habitat Homeownership applications is high debt-to-income ratios. This new workshop is to help these denied applicants improve their financial situations and ultimately be better qualified for future homeownership through the Habitat program. The class is also open to the public.

## Home Repair Completions Tripled This Year

Nine home repair projects were completed for residents of Loudoun County who already own a home, impacting 25 lives including projects to help seniors and veterans safely age in place.



## Future Homeowners Complete Sweat Equity

In spite of COVID restrictions, future homeowners, their families and friends spent 854 hours volunteering to complete sweat equity hours.

## Workshops Build a Toolbox of Knowledge

In addition to 149 hours of homeowner education that were completed by our future homeowners through financial literacy and home maintenance classes, the *Tools for Life Learning Center* hosted 25 free workshops available to the public. ## Local Youth Join the Habitat Mission

Several high schools have organized Habitat clubs to learn and support the work of Habitat here in Loudoun County. These clubs engage in fundraising, advocacy, build projects and volunteer.

## ReStore Continues to Pivot During COVID

COVID has made the thrift store operations at the ReStore challenging due to less shoppers, restrictions with donations, reduced store hours, and staff shortages. We are proud of the staff that pushed through to keep the doors open and supporting the mission of Habitat. Check out the new Mission Wall located at the front entrance.



## Board Committees Plan for the Future

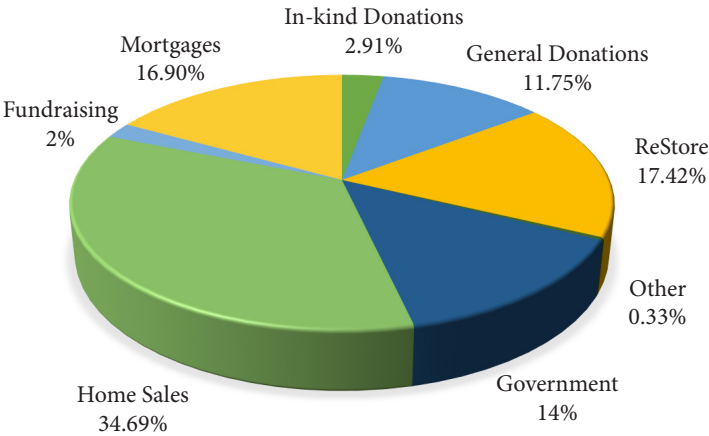

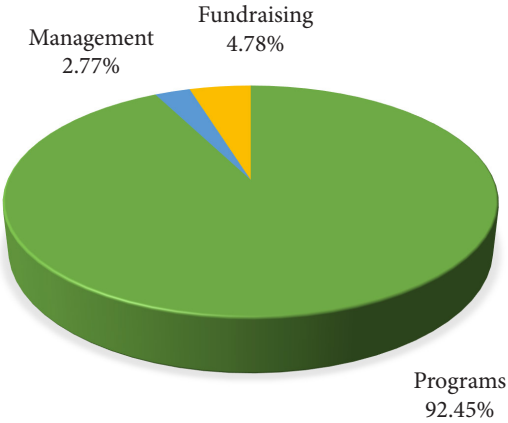


# Financial Highlights
